Facts about Autism:

- Autism is a complex developmental disability that is defined by a certain set of behaviors and is a "spectrum disorder" that affects individuals differently and to varying degrees.
- 1 in 110 individuals are diagnosed with autism, making it more common than pediatric cancer, diabetes, and AIDS combined.
- 67 children are diagnosed per day, a new case diagnosed about every 20 minutes.
- Autism is the fastest-growing serious developmental disability in the US with a 10-17% annual growth.
- Autism occurs in all racial, ethnic, and social groups and is 4 times more likely to strike boys than girls.
- Children can not "outgrow" Autism. Early detection, however, can significantly improve outcomes.
- ASA estimates that the lifetime cost of caring for a child with autism ranges from \$3.5 million to \$5 million.
